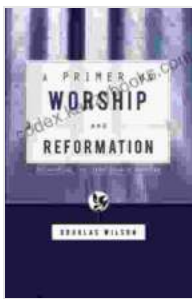

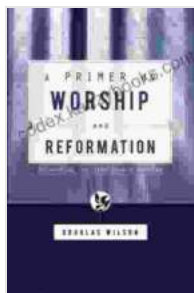
The Importance of Worship
