


Boathouse Row

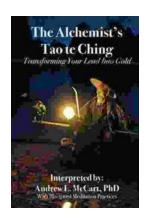
